## MUA VOTES TO BECOME CIO

At a Special General Meeting, held via Zoom on 4<sup>th</sup> October 2021, MUA Treasurer Sandy Ellis announced the results of a poll of member congregations, about changing the Registered Charity status of the MUA from a simple Registered Charity to a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) with voting members. Six congregations had voted, plus members of the MUA's Executive Committee and three Life Members. The total number of votes cast was 143, representing 78% of the membership. Of these votes, 87% were in favour of the proposal.

As there was more than a 2/3<sup>rd</sup> majority in favour, a resolution to apply to the Charity Commission to register a new charity in the name of 'Midland Unitarian Association Incorporated', being a Charitable Incorporated Organisation with voting members, was passed unanimously.

The President thanked Sandy Ellis for organising this and for all his hard work so far. This was seconded by acclaim. Bronwen Taylor thanked him for taking on this huge task.
