TEDDY BEARS FOR SEND A CHILD TO HUCKLOW

The Lay Leader of Great Hucklow Unitarian Chapel, which is across the road from the Nightingale Centre in Derbyshire, posted this appeal on Facebook:

"First things first, we take all teddy bears. Upon receipt they are sorted. Steps and thinking:

1 Bears relating to Christmas or Easter are removed and retained by the Chapel for those seasonal celebrations.

2 Over-large teddies are separated and at some point a school trip is spoilt and they ALL get large teddies. Wow!

3 Bears with mechanics or batteries are extracted and passed onto a local charity shop. Safety matters.

4 Bears that have been formerly loved or are over-loved (worn out) are retired and passed onto a local craft group in Chesterfield. No landfill.

5 Bears that are perceived to be status bears (Winnie the Pooh, Tigger, Scooby Doo etc) are put to one side and donated to the Village Gala where they help raise money for local causes chosen by GH Community Spirit. They are popular and this avoids squabbles among school children and school groups.

6 Mini-bears are placed to one side and collected into a crate – these are available for anyone & all to take and dip into & act as a back-up to the main supply of bears. Always good to have reserves!

7 Bears that are damaged, torn, dirty etc are assessed. Where appropriate, they are repaired or washed and any that are too far gone are passed to the local craft group to use the materials. We ensure all bears are loved and put to use.

This leaves us with the main stay of teddies and bears ready for the staff at The Nightingale Centre, Great Hucklow. These are ordered in the back two pews of the Chapel and when a group of children is due to visit the staff come and select the appropriate number of bears and teddies. The tags are then attached asking the children to name the bear, take them home and to be their friend!

We reckon we are handling in excess of 300 bears a year and we are in constant need of new donations." **CAN YOUR CONGREGATION HELP?**
